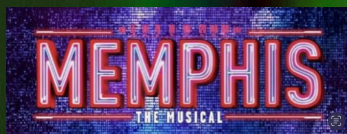

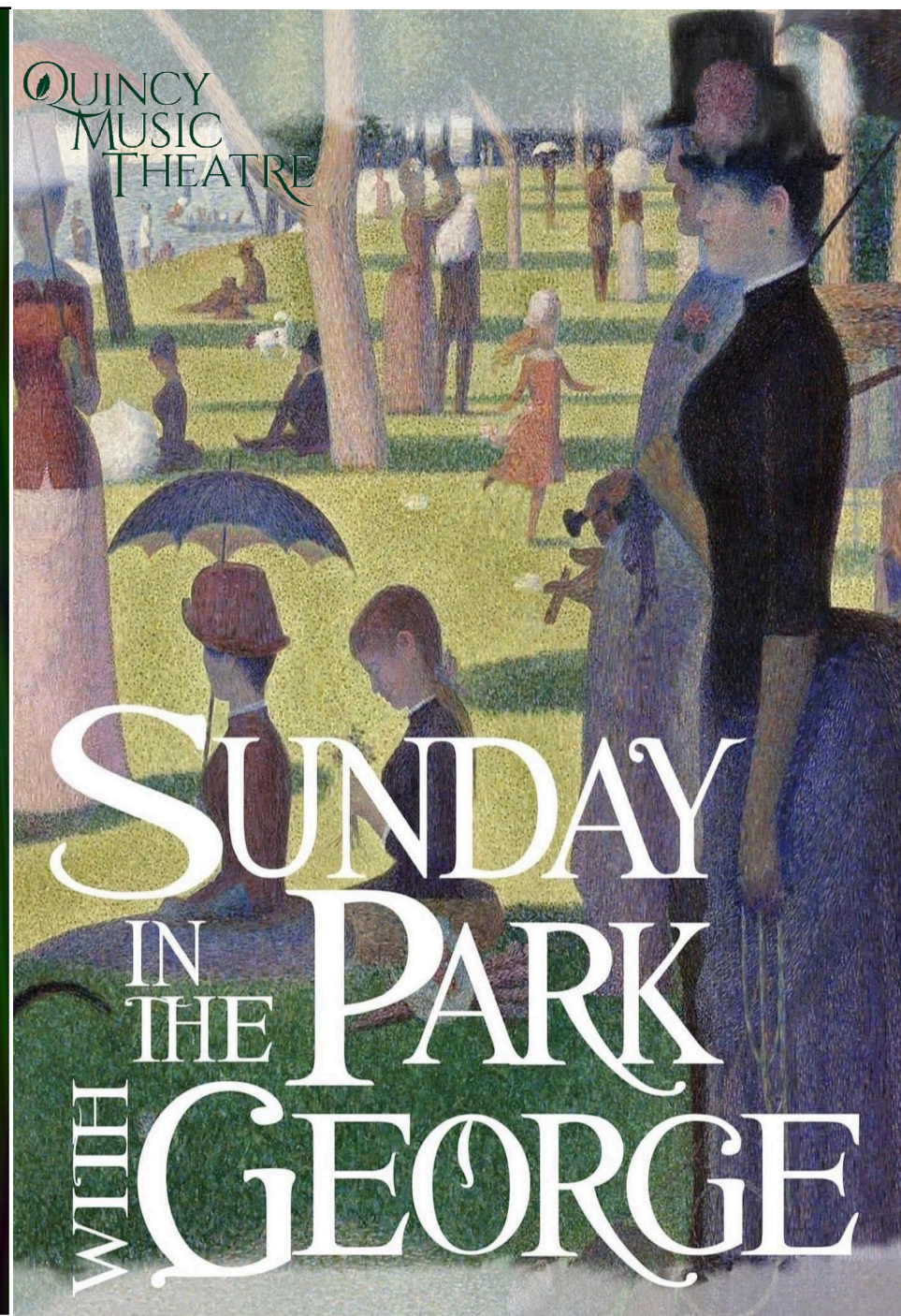

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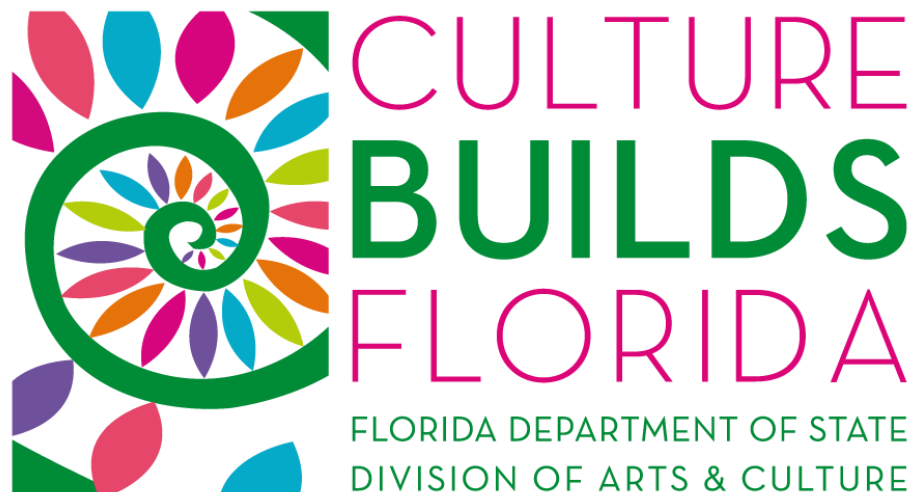
The Story

Director's Note

I immediately gravitate to the stories I can visualize on stage as I read the words in the script. That is exactly what happened for me with *Sunday in the Park with George*. I instantly saw the beauty in this story come to life in my head. I, as George would say, saw “Color and Light”. Although the story centers on the fact that George is isolated from those around him, unable to connect to anyone- I was instantly drawn to his character. In both acts of the script, there is a theme of trying to make an impact, a connection. George struggles to be present in “real time” with those who surround him. To me George is a reminder to be reserved and to be slow to action-time is precious and if you are not living in the moment, you cannot enjoy the future. I reminded the cast throughout the rehearsal process that stillness is just as powerful as movement.

Throughout the show there are 7 words that resurface: Order, Design, Tension, Composition, Balance, Light, and Harmony. I wanted to bring them each to the forefront so throughout rehearsals the team and I would focus in on one of these words and continue to connect it to the material. As you watch this show about a painting coming to life, you will see not only George’s interaction and connections with these seven words, but also each of the ensemble members’ connection.

I encourage you to keep these words in your mind when watching the show. What is the order of things? What is being designed? How is harmony being created by tension?

One of the most fascinating parts of this show and its connection to the painting is that even though the painting appears to reflect one moment in the park, it is rather a variation of moments captured by George during individual times on a Sunday - some of them being internal interactions and others external.

As an audience member I want you to see the show not only in the way that George sees the world, but also how the world sees George...then will the chaos turn and reveal something more grand and ‘Beautiful’.

Thank you for allowing me to share my passion and creation with you.
